



Applicants must complete this Lautenberg Amendment Compliance form to be considered for employment with the OIG as a criminal investigator. Completion of this form by applicants is voluntary; however, failure to complete it will disqualify applicants from consideration for an OIG law enforcement position.

Incumbents are required to complete this Lautenberg Amendment Compliance form. Agency disciplinary action, up to and including removal, may be undertaken if incumbents fail to complete this form or if you fail to reply fully and truthfully. Failure to complete this form may result in a referral to the Special Inquiries Division.

The purpose is to obtain information that will assist in the determination of suitability for law enforcement or other positions requiring the use or handling of a firearm.

Neither answers nor any information or evidence gained by reason of answers can be used in any criminal prosecution for a violation of Title 18, U.S.C. § 922 (g) (9). However, the answers furnished and any resulting information or evidence may be used in prosecution for knowingly and willfully providing false statements or information, and in the course of agency disciplinary proceedings.
